Martha: At Lincoln and Main.

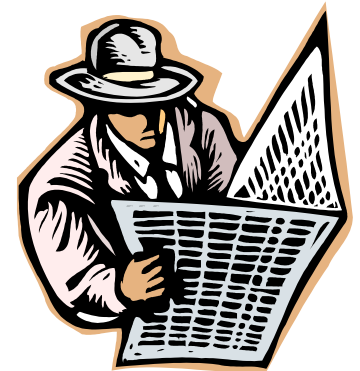
Sam: Is the pay decent? **Do** they have benefits?







- Martha Hey Sam, are you a medical assistant at the clinic?

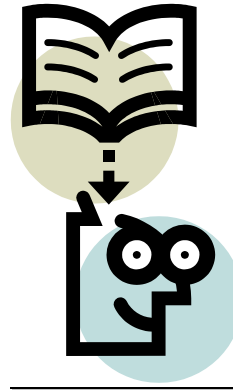
