

LEVEL I – PRONOUNS



PRONOUNS			
s=singular pl=plural	m=masculine f=feminine n=neuter	Subject	Possessive Adjective
1st person (s)		I	My
2nd person (s)		You	Your
3rd person (s)(m)		He	His
3rd person (s)(f)		She	Her
3rd person (s)(n)		It	Its
1st person (pl)		We	Our
2nd person (pl)		You	Your
3rd person (pl)		They	Their

Some pronouns can begin a sentence:

1. A **subject pronoun** conducts the action in a sentence. (*subject > verb*)
2. A **possessive adjective** describes a noun, and it comes before a noun.
 - Ex: **Our** house is beautiful.

Some pronouns can end a sentence:

3. An **object pronoun** receives the action in the sentence. (*verb > object*)
 - Ex: **I** love **her**.
 - **I** (*subject*) love (*action*) and **her** (*object*) is being loved (*action received*)

4. A **possessive pronoun** replaces a noun.

- Ex: Walter's car is old. **Mine** is newer.

* *Possessive pronouns and possessive adjectives NEVER have apostrophes.*

1st person (s)		Me	Mine
2nd person (s)		You	Yours
3rd person (s)(m)		Him	His
3rd person (s)(f)		Her	Hers
3rd person (s)(n)		It	(not used)
1st person (pl)		Us	Ours
2nd person (pl)		You	Yours
3rd person (pl)		Them	Theirs

5. A **possessive noun** shows ownership.

- Ex: Mario's hair is black. (—'s shows ownership)

Do not confuse possessive pronouns with possessive nouns.

**If a possessive noun ends with an "s", it does not require an extra —'s; instead, add only an apostrophe at the end of the pronoun.*

- Ex: Luis' hair is brown.
